



% of Member companies located in each Mid Wales region




Size of Member companies located in Mid Wales region by


Current Demand from Existing Businesses


Supply Chain Development

Part of the current remit of MWMG is to develop local supply chains amongst its companies, 95% of our survey respondents use local supply chains.

- 62% would like to see more support for local networking events in this sector
- 56% would like to be made aware of and create further opportunities for supply chains
- 56% supported the development of a local Supply Chain Directory
- 81% wanted to see more being done to extend the existing supply chains in Wales (75% UK, 37% Europe, 12% ROW)
