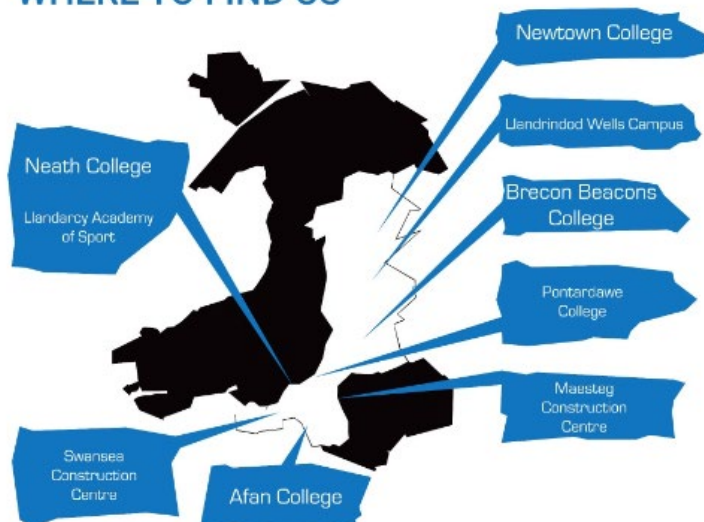
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## NPTC Group of Colleges: Background

- Degree Apprenticeships at Level 5-7 in Computing and IT (offered April 2019) and Engineering (considered for September 2019)

## Complex Curriculum Planning

- Maintain an appropriate range of up-to-date vocational subject areas across the region
- Develop new courses where there is identified demand and remove courses where necessary
- The Welsh Government directs the College in terms of the curriculum offer based on policy priorities and other priorities identified through the Regional Learning Skills Partnership
- Working closely with university partners to plan the curriculum for students in order to increase choice and promote Degree links
- The College works closely with employers and is committed to planning a provision to meet emerging employment opportunities and skills demand

## Upskilling@Work

- European Funded project providing subsidised funding for employers within Welsh Government priority areas

Two strands

- S01 – Levels 1 and 2 accredited qualifications – increasing the skills levels and work relevant skills for those employed with no or low skills
- S02 – Levels 3 to 6 accredited qualifications – to support the workforce in gaining higher technical/intermediate skills
- European funding eligibility applies



## Skills Development Fund

- Welsh Government has allocated funding from the Further Education budget to support skills development across priority areas
- NPTC has secured circa £400k for Powys up to end July 2019
- Flexible delivery, small bite-sized learning
- Accredited or non-accredited
- Progression to complete full qualification
